However, I would be remiss in not reminding everyone about water safety as we continue with the summer season and the upcoming July 4th Holiday. So, please have a conversation with your guests and remind them about swimming and boater safety guidelines. Check out the Handbook of Michigan Boating Laws and Responsibilities for a quick reference. At the Annual Meeting on May 19th, the Loch Erin election occurred for the Board of Directors. First, I would like to recognize and thank outgoing Board members Christiam Malcolm, Daphne Williams and Tom Ciepichal for their dedicated service. The Board would like to welcome Randy Hutchison, Bob MacDonald and Chris Denunizo to the LEPOA Board. Randy has accepted the Treasurer role, Bob has Fish & Wildlife and Chris will serve as the Vice President. The other Board members are Phil Kittridge (Water Quality), Eric Cullum (Compliance), Kathy Zmijewski (Parks Committee), and in addition to the President's role I will continue as the Building Committee chair. On behalf of our entire community, I'd like to thank them for agreeing to serve our LEPOA community and for contributing their time and effort to make Loch Erin such a great place to live. The Board is working on numerous issues that are important to our community. Our highest priority is to continue our focus on water quality and work with the State agencies on our watershed management plan. In addition, we will be working with our Sub-Associations in support of their issues. Please attend or review on the LEPOA Website (locheringoa.com) our monthly meeting minutes for updates on the various issues discussed and acted upon by your Board. Although the new & re-elected Board will have their first meeting on June 10th, they are involved with numerous items to improve our community and our Parks. You will see evidence of that activity in the upcoming weeks. Here are some highlights;

- A boat washing event was coordinated by Tim Husband at Eberly Park on June 9th to provide a service and education to those LEPOA members who participated regarding preventing invasive species transfer to our Lake.
- Watershed management revised plans are being coordinated by Phil, and they are
 focused on a Statewide ordinance for septic tank and leach field inspections, please
 contact Phil to see how you can reach out to our elected officials to encourage them to
 support this needed legislation.
- Although mother nature has been kind to us considering last year's ice damage on the
 parks and trees in our community. Kathy has been very active with her Liaison team to
 patrol and keep our parks looking good. Kathy had arranged the work on the
 Pickleball Courts to approve their appearance and she is working with Chris D. to
 review the communication and reliability aspects of the gate at Eberly Park.
- Our community is still a desired place to live. This is evidenced by the building committee permit reviews for new homes. Since last year 2023 (June 1st) the Building Committee reviewed and approved 11 new homes within our Loch Erin community. The Building Committee is represented by Chris Denunizo, Patrick Coulter and Don Deneweth.

Last, but not least, enjoy the lake this summer! Be safe and courteous when on the water (and land). Believe it or not the Fireworks will be upon us soon!




Association Dues

Parks Updates



Water Quality Updates

Our multiyear study of the watershed will be completed in the next few months. This initiative was supported by a \$100,000.00 grant from EGLE/EPA and when finalized will expedite both funding and approval of remedial action identified in the plan document. A key finding of the work indicates excessive phosphorous presence both in the lake and the drains, streams and ditches feeding into the lake. Phosphorous is one of the key nutrients contributing to the growth of Cyanobacteria (Blue/Green Algae) present in lakes and streams. Excessive Phosphorous is generally considered a result of agriculture runoff in our area, but DNA analysis indicates a large presence of human DNA implying household septic systems upstream of Loch Erin may be a large contributor. Things you can do to help decrease phosphorus in our water:

- -Ironically, Michigan, the water wonderland State with over 12,000 lakes, is the only state in the country without a statewide septic code. Contact your state and local representatives and commissioners encouraging them to support an effective and meaningful septic code for Michigan.
- -Ensure lawn fertilizers used on your lawn do not contain phosphorus. Those watering with lake water will get more than enough from the lake water.
- Establish native plants or a no-mow buffer zone at your shoreline. This will absorb runoff before it enters the lake and has the side benefit of discouraging ducks and geese from entering your property.
- -Do not deposit yard or pet waste in the roadside ditches surrounding Loch Erin. Material in the ditches will decompose and runoff into the lake as excess phosphorous. Dog walkers should always pick up after their pets and dispose of it properly. Four rounds of water sampling are scheduled for this year starting in mid-June. Again, this year, minimal aquatic plant treatment is being planned for mid-summer.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Inland Lakes observe a standard counter-clockwise direction around the lake to minimize potential for accidents.
- 2. There is a 100 foot no wake zone around the shoreline of all inland lakes. This includes islands and the ends of docks.
